Commencement News - Class of 2005

Thirty-six men and women were honored as the 34th class of the University of Connecticut School of Dental Medicine during commencement ceremonies under the tent on May 15, 2005.

Chosen by his classmates, Aaron Liddell spoke for the UConn School of Dental Medicine's graduating class. Aaron is pursuing a medical degree and certificate in oral and maxillofacial surgery and will continue his studies at the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio.

The keynote speaker was New York State Health Commissioner, Dr. Antonia Novello. Dr. Novello was appointed Surgeon General of the United States from

1990-1993, by President George Bush. During her three-year term in office, Novello focused on the health of women, children and minorities, playing an important role in launching the Healthy Children Ready to Learn Initiative. Prior to her term as Surgeon General, Novello for 12 years worked at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), where she rose through the ranks until being named deputy director of the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. Since leaving the national post, Novello has served with UNICEF, the United Nations' children's health organization, as a special representative for health and nutrition. In addition, Dr. Novello is a member of the National Women's Hall of Fame.

Message from the Dean

It was a monumental day for dentistry in the State of Connecticut on July 8, 2005. The Governor signed House Bill 6819--an act concerning access to oral health care (now known as Public Act 05-212) into law. This new law supplements the current dental practice act in several enlightened ways. The most important features of the new law (in my mind): (1) dental hygienists can deliver local anesthesia under general supervision; (2) DDS/DMD graduates of CDA accredited dental schools can substitute a PGY-1 (or specialty residency) program for a clinical board examination (PGY-1 alternative pathway); (3) foreign trained dentists (FTD) can become educationally eligible for a regular state dental license if they have completed two years of advanced training in a CDA approved program plus two years of practice in a safety net facility in the state or served three years on the faculty in a dental school in Connecticut, (4) there is a mandatory CE requirement for dentists (finally!).

Though I co-chaired the legislative subcommittee that wrote this legislation, this incredibly positive legislative action was the result of a great deal of hard work and cooperation from the following groups: Connecticut Dental Society, the State's Dental Hygiene Association, the School of Dental Medicine, the Department of Public Health, Connecticut Health Foundation, Coalition on Oral Health Initiative, Friends of Retarded Citizens of Connecticut and the Public Health Committee of the House.

One note of caution to our students: I believe it would be prudent to sign up for and take the clinical board exam for (NERB) this next year. Though there is evidence that the PGY-1 alternative may spread to many other states, it would be wise for students to take the clinical exam so as not to limit their options.

International Team for Implantology Scholarship Winners

Dr. Thomas Taylor, Department Head of the Department of Oral Rehabilitation, Biomaterials and Skeletal Development recently returned from the June meeting of the International Team for Implantology (ITI) World Symposium, June 18 - 20 in Munich.

He reports that three of the eight speakers selected for the ITI scholarship program (similar to a postdoctoral fellowship) oral competition were faculty with School of Dental Medicine ties. **Dr. Francesca Vailati** did her prosthodontic residency here finishing in 2003 and is on faculty at the University of Geneva. **Dr. Yukihiisa Takahashi** was an ITI scholar here with the Department of Prosthodontics during 2003-04 and is currently in private practice in Yokohama, Japan. Dr. Peter Schleier was an ITI scholar here (primarily in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery with Dr. David Shafer but also in Prosthodontics) from 2004-2005. He is now a faculty member at Jena University in Germany.

This program that the ITI sponsors is for dental specialists in oral and maxillofacial surgery, periodontics and prosthodontics. It is very competitive (about 60 applications for only 17 slots), and during the past decade 85 scholarships have been awarded. UConn is one of the 17 scholarship centers. The 85 past scholars were invited to submit application to be on the symposium program in a clinical forum competition where they would show documentation of cases they had treated during their scholarship year. Only eight of the presentations could be fit into the program for the symposium so the selection rate for the abstracts was very competitive. Of the eight chosen, three were from UConn! Just as impressive is that the judges of the competition declared a tie for the winner and the two selected were Drs. Vailati and Takahashi.

Dr. Ellen Eisenberg (Oral Diagnosis) shares with us the news that **Dr. Richard Zarbo** now holds the Kathleen D. Ward Chair in Pathology in Henry Ford Hospital and Medical Group. Dr. Zarbo is a graduate of both the School of Dental Medicine (1978) and the School of Medicine (1981),

and is board certified in Anatomic and Clinical Pathology. He has written over 180 papers and book chapters in the fields of diagnostic surgical pathology and quality assurance. He serves on numerous editorial review boards including the Archives of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, the American Journal of Surgical Pathology, Modern Pathology and the American Journal of Clinical Pathology.

Mrs. Ward and her husband established the Ward Fund, a charitable foundation formed to benefit people of all races, faiths and beliefs. As president of the Ward Fund, she passed a resolution that upon her death the entire worth of the fund would be distributed equally to the educational and health institutions which she felt could make the most difference in Southeast Michigan.

A portion of her fund has made the establishment of the Kathleen D. Ward Chair in Pathology possible, in order to promote excellence in care, medical education, and research. In addition, Dr. Zarbo serves as Chair of the College of American Pathologists (CAP) Education Committee and has led College quality efforts as Chair of the Quality Practices Committee.

Kate's summer research project was supported by a training grant from NIH to Dr. Arthur Hand. The School of Dental Medicine supported Kate's travel to Florida to present her findings to experts in taste and smell. Kate's research shows that chlorhexidine gluconate, a bisbiguanide antiseptic used in mouthrinses to control bacteria, acts as if it competes with salty and bitter taste stimuli for molecular receptors, thereby distorting taste perception. The Dental School has a strong research program that encourages students to contribute to scientific discovery.
